III. Review Introduced Criminal Justice Legislation

Molly Edwards provided the ACJC-sponsored legislation language for the State County Municipal Open Data System bill resulting from HB2166 and the statewide criminal justice audit that ACJC conducted. All the information is currently available and readily reportable. The bill's end addressed the appropriations needed to complete the project and make it operational. Director Andrew LeFevre stated this is a starting point to get a draft for the legislative council to begin the process and outline through the spring and fall by creating two reports. Stakeholder groups could provide additional inputs and the opportunity for groups to understand what the legislature would recommend or mandate that agencies report to ACJC through the built system. The Committee asked about a sponsor, and ACJC staff is looking at potential sponsors in the house and senate as a mirror bill. After review, Commissioner Stahl entered a motion to approve the bill in concept giving staff direction to move forward with the proposed legislation. The motion seconded by Designee Rebecca Baker was unanimously approved by the Committee.
