I. Call to Order and Roll Call

Chairperson David Sanders called the meeting to order at 11:00 am. Molly Edwards took roll call, and a quorum was declared.

II. Minutes of the April 4, 2021 meeting

Chairperson Sanders called for a motion on the Committee meeting minutes on April 4, 2021. Commissioner Dave Byers entered a motion to approve the minutes. The motion seconded by Commissioner Jean Bishop was unanimously approved by the Committee.

III. Review Introduced Criminal Justice Legislation

Molly Edwards summarized other potential bills, including SB 1024 that designates ACJC as the fiscal agent for \$500,000 to distribute to counties less than 500,000 persons for domestic violence cases.

Ms. Edwards then referred to Executive Director Andy LeFevre to review ACJC Criminal Justice Legislation.

IV. Review proposed CJEF Balance Notification Bill

Mr. LeFevre reviewed the draft legislation for the CJEF Balance Notification Bill tied the criminal justice monies penalty assessments attributed to the criminal justice enhancement funding decline. Staff would like to create a baseline amount of funding and have the Commission put forward an appropriate level of funds asking for supportive bill concepts with the possibility of amending the bill language and separating the \$2 additional assessments. We will continue to meet with the legislators and build the support needed. **Commissioner Dave Byers** entered a motion to support the bill as written subject to the Attorney General's office guidance. The motion seconded by **Commissioner Jean Bishop** was unanimously approved by the Committee.

V. Review proposed Victim Fund Balance Notification Bill

Mr. LeFevre reviewed the draft legislation for the Victim Fund Balance Notification victim fund, minimal balance notification bill. He explained that the victim compensation and assistance fund funding is primarily out of the criminal justice enhancement fund and has also seen a significant decline. The program has been cut in the last two years in the funding cycle. Staff reviewed how the compensation fund is provided on claims and compared to the computerized criminal history system records for the types of crimes associated with them. The amount for the bill settled on is \$12.5M allowing \$10M in programmatic expenses and \$1.5M in administrative costs. Commissioner Steve Stahl moved to support the legislation with the dollar figure provided by staff. The motion seconded by Commissioner Sheila Polk was unanimously approved by the Committee.
