SUBJECT: PRIORITY PLANNING ADVISORY COMMITTEE MEETING (PPAC)

Pursuant to the A.R.S. 28-6951(B), the ADOT Director has appointed the members of the Priority Planning Advisory Committee (PPAC) to develop the Five Year Transportation Facilities Construction Program. In addition, pursuant to A.R.S. 28-339, the PPAC is responsible for taking certain actions with respect to the State Match for the Rural Transportation (AZ-SMART) fund. This meeting is scheduled, pursuant to the above referenced statutes, to review the Five Year Transportation Facilities Construction Program, make changes and schedule new projects into the adopted Five Year Transportation Facilities Construction and take appropriate actions related to the AZ-SMART program and related applications.

ADOT'S NONDISCRIMINATION NOTICE TO THE PUBLIC

15. Project Description - Provide a concise, specific description of the Project, including the type of work to *be performed and benefits to be realized (3,000 character maximum, including spaces and punctuation).

This planning and pavement project addresses imminent flooding of our town and Northern AZ regions, caused by poor flooding infrastructure and planning throughout town and across SR 64. SR 64 does not have adequate drainage infrastructure to pass the 10-, 50-, or 100-year storm events. The only alternate route through Town is Long Jim Loop which lacks adequate infrastructure. Reclaim Lane is subject to flooding, cutting off access and compromising the critical waste water treatment facility. RP Drive is the default conveyance route of these major storm events. This project evaluates potential flooding issues to these corridors and routes, proposing mitigation measures for adequate levels of service. This project establishes a Comprehensive Drainage Master Plan, Design Concept Report, and Construction Documents. This is a transportation, health and safety need following inadequate planning and installation of the highway's current flood channel and culverts.

Protecting SR 64 and alternate roadway(s) is important and mitigation measures must avoid adverse impacts to surrounding properties and critical town infrastructure, like the Sanitary District. The transportation corridors and Sanitary District are integral to the Life and Safety of our community during flood events. Developing a plan with no adverse impact to the Sanitary District and other critical stakeholders is imperative. The technical expertise of the Coconino County Flood Control District and floodplain administrator will be integral.

SR 64 is the most-accessed highway that travels through Tusayan. Between 9,000 - 11,000 vehicles utilize this route daily to visit the Grand Canyon. The RP Drive/Long Jim Loop roadway is the only viable alternative road in Tusayan. These roads will be rendered impassable during 10-, 50- or 100-year storm events on Coconino Wash.

Addressing these safety issues reduces the potential for flooding and natural disaster. SR 64 is the major thoroughfare through Tusayan, its commercial district, and the only residential access is through connecting streets (mostly the RP Drive/Long Jim Loop road). The project area roads are a vital artery for essential services like the sanitization district, fire district, Town's fire hydrants, camping, community facilities and more. It's also the alternate access to the western portion of Main Street in downtown Tusayan and the APS substation.

Earlier this year the Town endured a large rainfall event, and became flooded by this roadway, with floods reaching the Town's doorstep and beyond, causing significant challenges, damages and impact. This could have been catastrophic during seasonal visitation to the Grand Canyon. Strengthening AZ's safety and transportation priorities, this project can prevent tens of millions of dollars in damage to property and person, as well as damaging key trade and distribution routes. It helps ensure AZ's main tourist destination will remain open, accessible, and safe to the public.

The purpose of this letter is to provide a cost estimate (Opinion of Probable Costs) for the planning and design phase of the Tusayan Highway 64 Flood Mitigation and Paving project. This phase of the project will include Pre-Design Services, Comprehensive Master Drainage Plan, Design Concept Report, Construction Documents, and Project Administration and Management. The Pre-Design Services will include project scoping, grant writing, Request for Qualifications (RFQ) preparation, Statement of Qualifications (SOQ) Review and selection, as well as project scoping and fee negotiations. This will be followed up with preparation of the Comprehensive Master Drainage Plan (CMDP). The CMDP will include hydrology and hydraulic evaluation of the existing conditions, an identification of the problematic drainage areas, mitigation alternatives, and 15% conceptual plans for each alternative. This project displays the initiative taken by the Town of Tusayan to address the need for substantial flood-related improvements to Highway 64 and Long Jim Loop/RP Drive Road, which are essential roadways regularly used by both the Town of Tusayan's residents and millions of Grand Canyon National Park visitors each year (an average of 9,000 – 11,000 travelers along this stretch of Highway 64 per day).
