I. Call to Order and Roll Call

Commissioner David Sanders called the meeting to order at 1:30 pm. **Ms. Boyle** took roll call, and a quorum was declared.

II. Minutes of the January 27, 2023 meeting

Commissioner Sanders called for a motion on the Committee meeting minutes for January 27, 2023. **Commissioner Jean Bishop** entered a motion to approve the minutes. The motion seconded by **Designee Rebecca Baker** was unanimously approved by the Committee.

III. Update on ACJC priority legislation and amendments

Molly Edwards gave the legislative briefing on ACJC priority legislation. On HB 2195, staff met with stakeholders, compiled questions and concerns, and created a Question & Answer document for stakeholders. The team is working with the legislative council to craft new amendments.

There are concerns about personally identifying information and locator information. The amendment is aggregated data. On SB 1588, the bill was dropped and assigned to maps and appropriations.

IV. Review Introduced Criminal Justice Legislation

Ms. Edwards proceeded to discuss the review of the introduced criminal justice legislation.

The legislature has been in session for 27 days, with 1,417 bills introduced and 191 bills tracked. HB 2333 is the coordinated reentry planning program for the counties. Appropriates \$17M and passed in judiciary hearing. HB 2418 requires law enforcement patrol officers to achieve a response time to each emergency call of five minutes or less. Received amendment on the emergency call time, referred to maps and rules. ACJC would add six new FTEs with a \$500,000 appropriation, and the auditor general would have an annual audit of the process and data used. The Committee would monitor this bill. HB 2168 extends through 7/1/28, and SB 1088 eliminates the 7/1/23 repeal date for the statute. Both are Good Samaritan bills, and **Commissioner Dave Byers** entered a motion to support both bills. The motion seconded by **Designee Rebecca Baker** was unanimously approved by the Committee. SB 1059 – the polygraph bill went to maps and passed out of hearing. The Committee will continue to monitor this bill.
