#### I. Call to Order and Roll Call

Chairperson David Sanders called the meeting to order at 1:30 pm. Molly Edwards took roll call, and a quorum was declared.

#### II. Minutes of the February 11, 2022 meeting

Chairperson Sanders called for a motion on the Committee meeting minutes for February 11, 2022. Commissioner Steve Stahl entered a motion to approve the minutes. The motion seconded by **Designee Rebecca Baker** was unanimously approved by the Committee.

#### III. Review Introduced Criminal Justice Legislation

Ms. Edwards discussed how the legislature is now into 40 days with a total of 1,678 bills introduced and will continue for hearing next week. HB 2132 - Minimum Balance Notification Victim Fund bill passed house appropriations on 2/16. HB2133 - Criminal Justice Monies Penalty Assessment bill failed to pass house judiciary on 2/9. Staff spoke to Senate staff to find a vehicle bill to revive the bill but did not use current language. Senate staff proposed removing AZ POST from the CJEF funding to redistribute those fundings and move AZ POST into the general fund. Staff floated other ideas to Senate staff of crafting bill language to instruct ACJC to conduct a thorough review of CJEF funding provide a report that would include recommendations to the legislature before the next session to address the revenue decline potentially. HB2573 - Alternative Prosecution and Diversion bill passed unanimously out of judiciary this past week and is scheduled for appropriations next week. The following bills are moving, and ACJC is tracking closely. SB1712 - Victim Notification bill - ACJC received a grant fund to initiate the victim notification system. Phase one of the system rolled out to the sheriffs. MCAO crafted the language as the language did not line up with the victim rights in Arizona and made sure the law enforcement agencies and prosecutors could use the automotive system voluntarily. The lobbyist for the bill is willing to accept some of the languages and is currently working on amendments. On HB2326 - Criminal Justice Data Collection bill, staff spoke to the courts. It offered an amendment with clarifying language that asks the superior court probation departments to provide the information for those individuals placed on supervised probations. Also, the staff asked for a delayed date to collect the data so ACJC could complete the data audit. HB2583 is the data collection bill for DUI Information, Annual Report. Discussions on if this bill is attainable because of two issues. Formatting of reports and having a delayed date of January 2024 for collection.
