I. Call to Order and Roll Call

II. Review and Approval of the Minutes of the October 25, 2018 Meeting

III. SAC Crime Victim Services Funding Overview

Catie Clark

Ms. Clark provided an overview of the work completed on the project up to this point and indicated that her unit is working to address gaps in the data as a result of lower than expected return rates and the time restrictions of the grant period, funding this effort. Ms. Clark indicated the SAC unit will make follow-up contact with agencies who are members of the State Agency Coordinating Team (SACT), a group made up of victim service funders, to provide clarification on the information requested for the report. SAC will also reach out to grantees and sub-grantees of the SACT funders who had not previously responded to encourage them to participate and provide additional information on the benefits of participating in the project.

IV. <u>Crime Victim Assistance Program</u>

Larry Grubbs

- A. FY2020 Grant Program Funding Level Mr. Grubbs presented the ACJC staff recommendation that total funding for the Crime Victim Assistance Program for FY2020 be set at \$750,000. Pat Lopez moved the recommendation be approved, Dave Cole seconded. The motion passed unanimously.
- B. FY2020 Grant Program Funding Priorities. Mr. Grubbs presented the ACJC staff recommendation for FY2020 funding priorities found on table VS2 of the agenda. Director Ryan called for a vote on approval. The members unanimously voted to approve the recommendation.

V. <u>Crime Victim Compensation Program</u>

Larry Grubbs

Mr. Grubbs provided history on the existing administrative expense policy, and how it was not changed or eliminated when the program changed to a grant agreement framework. Mr. Grubbs provided an example from an operational unit where the existing administrative expense policy restricted approval of some program expenses, which could be allowable under the grant agreement. Mr. Grubbs presented the ACJC staff recommendation that, effective upon Commission approval, the exiting administrative expense policy for the crime victim compensation program be eliminated. Director Ryan called for a vote of the members

to approve the recommendation. The members unanimously voted to approve the recommendation.

RECOMMENDATION:

The Crime Victims Committee recommends to the Commission that compensation funds for the current FY19 be reallocated to operational units. Reallocations will be made in accordance with Table VS-1 of the agenda, using the county allocation fund sources identified totaling \$70,000, and \$50,000 in State compensation funding held in reserve under program rule (R10-4-102.D).

DISCUSSION:

ACJC crime victim compensation program staff closely monitors county victim compensation expenditures throughout the fiscal year. Periodically it is necessary to adjust the original allocation to meet demand for compensation benefits statewide. The purpose of these adjustments is to reallocate compensation funding to those counties with enough demand to expend additional compensation funds by the end of the fiscal year.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Significant – Reallocation of up to \$120,000 in FY 2019 crime victim compensation funds to county programs.

The Crime Victims Committee recommends to the Commission the allocation of \$4,563,887 in state and federal crime victim compensation funds, as proposed in Table VS-3 of the agenda, to Operational Units (OU) for the FY20 Crime Victim Compensation Program.

DISCUSSION:

Table VS-3 reflects the dollar amounts proposed for allocation to each OU for the 15 counties. The allocation formula approved at the November 2018 Commission meeting includes the following process steps:

- \$50,000 of approved state funding level retained in emergency reserve (R10-4-102.D);
- Five percent of most recent federal VOCA award allocated to ACJC for administrative costs;
- o Fixed administrative allocation of state funds to each OU (R10-4-102.H);
- A base allotment of \$25,000 to each OU;
- A reduction to the base allotment equal to restitution/subrogation reserve overage amount for OUs with restitution/subrogation fund balances exceeding a three-year annual average benefit expense reserve (R10-4-102.G);
- The remaining balance distributed as follows:
 - 50% based on prior years' program benefit expenditure average;
 - 30% based on average share of crime;
 - 20% based on population.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Significant – Distribution of \$4,563,887 in compensation funds to operational units in FY20.







DISCUSSION:

At the end of the current fiscal year 2019, the available fund balance in the Crime Victim Compensation and Assistance Fund is estimated to be \$2.9 million. This is the amount carried over in the fund from year to year. Program allocations from the fund for FY 2020 are budgeted to be \$4.4 million, while revenue for the same period is projected to be about \$3.6 million. Program staff seeks committee guidance related to the fund balance. Discussion could include identifying an acceptable fund balance total to maintain in the account from year to year, and the initial steps of identifying possible program area reductions for FY 2021.
