III. Crime Victim Services Funding Discussion

Heather Bohnet provided an update on funding available and provided the results of the victim services funding survey completed by ACJC's Statistical Analysis Center, explaining that a final report is in the process of being developed and will be provided to the committee upon completion. Heather provided information to the committee on the funding sources and the amounts awarded to agencies at a county level as well as information on crime rate data for those counties as a comparison and answered questions regarding the information presented.

Heather Bohnet also provided information on a gap analysis completed by ACJC staff and answered questions committee members had regarding that information.

IV. <u>Crime Victim Assistance Program</u>

A. FY 2023 Grant Program Funding Level

Staff presented the recommendation to the committee for the FY2023 program size. The Chairperson allowed for presentations on the impact of victim assistance funds from Chrysalis, North Country Healthcare, Victim Witness for Coconino County, and Haven Family Resource Center. The Committee discussed the staff recommendation to the committee regarding the

program size. Mr. Laughner moved to recommend the Victim Assistance program size of \$500,000 for FY23. Ms. Cox seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

B. FY 2023 Grant Program Funding Priorities

Staff presented the recommendation to the committee for the FY2023 funding priorities. The committee discussed the staff recommendation. Shawn Cox moved to accept the priorities as recommended by staff. Virginia Rodriguez seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

Recommended Action	The Crime Victims Committee recommends to the Commission that compensation funds for the current FY22 be reallocated to operational units in accordance with Table VS-1 of the agenda.
Details/Discussion	ACJC crime victim compensation program staff closely monitors county victim compensation expenditures throughout the fiscal year. Periodically it is necessary to adjust the original allocation to meet demand for compensation benefits statewide. The purpose of these adjustments is to reallocate compensation funding to those counties with enough demand to expend additional compensation funds by the end of the fiscal year.
Fiscal Impact	Significant – Reallocation of up to \$50,000 in FY 2022 crime victim compensation funds to county programs.

Recommended Action	The Crime Victims Committee recommends to the Commission that total state, federal and ARPA allocated funding for the FY23 Crime Victim Compensation Program be set at \$4,380,000; including \$2,000,000 in state compensation funds, \$1,480,000 in federal VOCA compensation funds, and \$900,000 in ARPA funds.
Details/Discussion	Based on prior year expenditures, state revenue projections, the submitted total legislative appropriation for FY23, available ARPA funds, and projected available federal funds, staff proposes the total program allocation be set at \$4,380,000 with expenditures made in accordance with the attached budget. The total program size includes \$2,000,000 in state compensation funds, \$1,480,000 in federal VOCA compensation funds, and \$900,000 in ARPA funds.
Fiscal Impact	Significant – Expenditure of \$4,380,000 in state and federal Crime Victim Compensation funds, and ARPA funds, for FY23.

Recommended Action	The Crime Victims Committee recommends to the Commission designating the 15 County Attorney's Offices as operational units for the FY 2023 Crime Victim Compensation Program.
Details/Discussion	The Commission is required to annually designate one operational unit (OU) for each county, to receive an allocation from state and/or federal compensation fund sources, and to administer the Crime Victim Compensation Program for that county during the state fiscal year. In accordance with compensation program rule R10-4-104(A) all 15 County Attorney's Offices are requesting designation as operational units for FY 2023. Staff proposes continuing the current designation of the County Attorney's Offices as operational units for FY 2023.
Fiscal Impact	Significant – Operational Units are responsible for the expenditure of state and federal Crime Victim Compensation funds for FY 2023.

Recommended Action	The Crime Victims Committee recommends to the Commission the allocation of \$4,380,000 in state and federal crime victim compensation funds, and ARPA funds, as proposed in Table VS-3 of the agenda, to operational units (OU) for the FY23 Crime Victim Compensation Program.
Details/Discussion	Table VS-3 reflects the dollar amounts proposed for allocation to each operational unit for the 15 counties. The allocation formula approved at the March 2020 Commission meeting includes the following process steps: • \$50,000 of the state funds retained in emergency reserve (R10-4-102.D); • Five percent of most recent federal VOCA award allocated to ACJC for administrative costs; • Fixed administrative allocation of state funds to each OU (R10-4-102.H); • A base allotment of \$25,000 to each OU; • The remaining balance distributed as follows: • 50% based on prior years' program benefit expenditure average; • 30% based on average share of crime; • 20% based on population.
Fiscal Impact	Significant – Distribution of \$4,380,000 in compensation funds to operational units in FY23.
