Joint Executive Legislative Committee Minutes

A public meeting of the Joint Executive Legislative Committee convened on **March 4, 2022**, at the Arizona Criminal Justice Commission office, 1110 W. Washington, Suite 230, Phoenix, AZ 85007.

I. Call to Order and Roll Call

Chairperson David Sanders called the meeting to order at 1:30 pm. **Ms. Boyle** took roll call, and a quorum was declared.

II. Minutes of the February 18, 2022 meeting

Chairperson Sanders called for a motion on the Committee meeting minutes for February 18, 2022. **Commissioner Steve Stahl** entered a motion to approve the minutes. **Designee Liana Garcia** requested a correction in the minutes stating **Commissioner Sanders** was proxy for **Commissioner Sheila Polk**. The move to accept the amended minutes made by **Commissioner Stahl** and seconded by **Commissioner Jean Bishop**. The Committee unanimously approved the minutes.

III. Review Introduced Criminal Justice Legislation

Molly Edwards discussed the legislature is into 54 days with 1,738 bills introduced. **HB2132** moved to the Senate last week and was assigned to appropriations, whereas **HB2133** became **SB1183**. In the bill, the language has the CJEF agencies were written out except for AZ POST and given a one-time allocation of \$5M. **HB2573**, the alternative prosecution and diversion fund bill passed out of the house with amendments - reduced from \$20M to \$10M - assigned to Senate judiciary and appropriations. On the tracking, there are two data bills that ACJC is monitoring. On **HB2326** - criminal justice collection bill, there is an amendment on the existing criminal justice data bill that requires ACJC to collect from the courts' specific immigration information. **Designee Garcia** stated that revision would show that adult probation - individuals under active supervision sent to ICE anyway. **Chair Sanders** alluded that during the investigation pre-sentencing phase, the contacts with ICE determine if the defendant is a foreign national and the status going forward. A supervised number of DV offenders from the lower courts do not report a presentence. The Committee discussed **HB2583** - the DUI Collection bill that requires AJC to collect all DUI data in the state and report to the Governor annually. The bill passed out of the house assigned to the judiciary in the Senate.

On **HB2166**, ACJC asked to let the agency go through the audit first to identify all the reported and available information and present what costs might be associated with a data system. Law enforcement representatives have concerns with the data points. Some references are if all data is collected, if the information is available, by what method of collection through various platforms, and the challenge of going through one central repository. **Designee Blaze Baggs** spoke about how the data is collected by categorizing all drugs into seven generic categories and the blood analysis as part of DUI. Not only is the generic category reported by the crime lab that does the research, in addition, but it also requires each DUI to be separated and lists which substance or substances appear in the analysis - much more than marijuana. **Mr. Baggs** stated the most significant obstacle is the different agencies reporting separately to ACJC, breaking into three categories: the law enforcement agency issuing the citation, the crime lab that did the analysis, and the courts. Each of the three parties is responsible for ACJC compiling, analyzing, and publishing. The Committee discussed the recommendation of monitoring the bill, staying neutral but expressing concerns. **Designee Garcia** motioned to draft an amendment and request that the sponsor amends the bill to provide a delayed effective date to July 1, 2024. The motion seconded by **Designee Rebecca Baker** was passed unanimously by the Committee.
