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1. Call to Order and Roll Call

At 1:30 p.m., the meeting was called to order by **Chief David Sanders**, **Ana Maris** conducted the roll call, and a quorum was established.

2. Minutes of the March 1, 2024 meeting

During the Committee meeting, **Chief David Sanders** requested a motion to approve the minutes. The motion was put forward by **Director David Byers** and was unanimously approved by the Committee, with **Designee Rebecca Baker** seconding the motion.

3. Update and Review of ACJC priority legislation

A. Update on SB1117

During the meeting, **Molly Edwards** updated the Committee on SB1117, which has passed through Senate COW and Third Read. A potential stakeholder amendment is being worked on. ACJC is trying to get this bill assigned to House MAPS.

B. Update on HB2716

Molly stated that the amendment placed on HB2716 has had some pushback. She is working on First Read and assigned to Senate MAPS

c. Update on HB2243

Molly stated that this bill passed out of the House and is currently on Senate Second Read. ACJC has signed in support of this bill.

D. Update on HB2782

Molly explained HB2782 to the Committee. \$500,000 would be appropriated to criminal justice agencies to create a tracking database that focuses on tracking crimes committed by and against individuals who identify as homeless. The bill failed on the floor on March 4th, but was brought back for reconsideration. **Steve Stahl** and **Director Byers** brought up some logistical concerns regarding the amendment. ACJC is currently trying to get clarification with the bill's sponsor about this.

4. Review Introduced Criminal Justice Legislation

Molly Edwards stated that ACJC is looking for striker amendments and any other last-minute changes that might be added to the Commission's bills. HB2743 is of concern to ACJC and the Commission is attempting to reach out to the bill's sponsor and the Secretary of State's office. Molly stated that SB1003 is moving and the Commission is not in support of this bill. HB2953 is a bill regarding public records, it is moving, and many agencies are in opposition. HB2134 and SB1408 are mirror bills, they are both moving, and law enforcement is in support of both of these bills. Designee Rebecca Baker mentioned and explained SB1216. There is a strike everything amendment on this bill, and Rebecca suggested that the Committee should be concerned about it, and prosecution agencies are trying to amend the bill. Daven Byrd mentioned SB1208. The language in the bill is of concern, Molly summarizes the bill. The Governor will most likely veto it.

5. Call to the Public

There were no emails or calls from the public.

The Joint Executive Legislative Committee meeting is scheduled to take place at the discretion of the chair.
