Call to Order, Roll Call, and Pledge of Allegiance

Chair Steve Stahl called the meeting to order at 1:30 pm and led everyone in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance. Executive Director Andrew LeFevre took roll call, and a quorum was declared.

1. Recognition of Sheila Polk

Sheila Polk was recognized for her service to the Arizona Criminal Justice Commission and was presented with a plaque from the agency.

2. Approval of the Previous Minutes

Chair Stahl called for a motion on the Commission meeting minutes on October 20, 2022. Executive Director LeFevre noted a correction in the minutes to show that he participated virtually rather than in person. Commissioner David Sanders entered a motion to approve the minutes with the amendment. Designee Rebecca Baker seconded the motion, and the Commission unanimously approved the minutes.

Chair Stahl called for a motion on the Commission meeting minutes on October 27, 2022. Commissioner Jean Bishop entered a motion to approve the minutes. Commissioner Sheila Polk seconded the motion, and the Commission unanimously approved the minutes.

3. Executive Director's Report

a. Staff and Program Updates

Executive Director LeFevre noted that the agency celebrated its 40th anniversary. He also honored Sheila Polk as she served as Chair and Vice Chair and provided the leadership and guidance for ACJC with a clear direction of where the Commission should be to criminal justice issues in the state.

b. Finance Update

4. Committee Reports

A. Executive

1. Update on the activities of the Committee

The Committee did not meet, but Chair Stahl noted that he would be reaching out to the Commissioners on comments for the review of Executive Director LeFevre.

2. Update on the activities of the Statistical Analysis Center

Matt Bileski reported that ACJC submitted the final HB 2166 report on 11/1, which include the amended language from the Commission.

Director LeFevre and Matt are attending the Justice Research and Statistics Association and presenting the report nationally.

3. Approval of Sexual Assault, Fill the Gap, and the Gang Threat Assessment Reports

Ana Daniels gave a brief presentation on the Sexual Assault report. Commissioner Polk entered a motion to approve the Sexual Assault report for distribution. The motion seconded by Commissioner Sanders was unanimously approved by the Commission.

Next, Ms. Daniels presented the Fill the Gap report. Commissioner Polk entered a motion to approve the Fill the Gap Report. The motion seconded by Commissioner Bishop was unanimously approved by the Commission.

Shayla Gilleland reported on the Gang Threat Assessment report to the Commission. Commissioner Bishop entered a motion to approve the Gang Threat Assessment report. The motion seconded by Commissioner Polk was unanimously approved by the Commission.

B. Drug, Gang and Violent Crime Control

1. Update on the activities of the Committee

The Committee met on 11/8 with recommendations for the Commission on the Phoenix Police Department Crime Reduction Project. 2. Phoenix Police Department Crime Reduction Project

Mr. Vidale presented the continuation of the Phoenix Police Department crime reduction project allocating \$20,000 in unexpended prior-year Byrne Justice Assistance Grant funding. After review, Commissioner Polk entered a motion to approve the award of \$20,000 in Byrne Justice Assistance Grant funding to the Phoenix Police Department Crime Reduction Project. The motion seconded by Commissioner David Byers was unanimously approved by the Commission.

3. The Rural County Alternative Prosecution and Diversion Grant Program

Mr. Vidale explained this funding came from laws 2022, Chapter 313, which appropriated \$10M from the General Fund ACJC to establish rural county diversion programs. Recommendation for the Rural County Alternative Prosecution and Diversion program includes a base amount of \$300,000 to the projects and an additional allocation dependent on project costs submitted. It also reflects an administrative allocation to ACJC of \$150,000.

After review, Commissioner Byers entered a motion to approve the award of \$9,850,000 in state general funds according to table DC 3 on page 19 of the agenda for the Rural County Alternative Prosecution and Diversion Grant Program beginning December 1, 2022, and ending on November 30, 2025. The motion seconded by Commissioner Bishop was unanimously approved by the Commission. 4. The 2022 Enhanced Drug and Gang Enforcement Report

Mr. Vidale reported the FY 2022 Enhanced Drug and Gang Enforcement Report highlights. After review, Commissioner Polk entered a motion to approve the FY 2022 Enhanced Drug and Gang Enforcement (EDGE) report. The motion seconded by Commissioner Byers was unanimously approved by the Commission.

C. Crime Victims

Commissioner Stahl referred to Heather Bohnet for updates to the Committee. The Committee met on 11/9 to discuss the victim assistance FY 24 grant, program size, and project priorities.

1. Update on the activities of the Committee

Commissioner Byers referred to Lloyd Y. Asato for updates to the Committee. Mr. Asato reported the Committee did not meet but had two updates that included Maricopa County Sheriff's target launch for VINE, which may move to January to work out technical requirements. Use of force reporting has 62 agencies registered and provided data.

E. Legislative

Commissioner Sanders explained the Committee is meeting in December to kick off ideas for the next legislative session.

2. Discussion of 2023 Legislative Session and Legislative Priorities

Molly Edwards revealed there are 41 new legislative members. She went over the roster and named some of the chairs of the committees. This challenge for 2023 is educating the new legislators, and ACJC will meet weekly with the legislative liaisons.
