I. Call to Order and Roll Call

The meeting was called to order by Chief David Sanders at 1:31 pm. Roll was taken and a quorum was present.

II. Approval of Minutes from February 19, 2021

Joe Grossman made the motion to approve the minutes. Ken Vick seconded the motion. Chairman Sanders noted that an "s" was missing on the second line to his name. He also questioned about whether Sheriff Nanos was in attendance. Motion passed unanimously.

III. Legislative Overview

Molly Edwards, Public Information Officer/Legislative Liaison asked the Committee if they would be open to meeting every other week since there isn't a need to have regular meetings for voting.

Ms. Edwards did an overview of bills that directly impact ACJC or have been an interest to the legislative committee. HB2166 Criminal Justice Commission; bill was assigned to Senate Judiciary on 2/24. Staff requested the Chairman hear the bill on 3/11 in conjunction with hearing a presentation on the Data Visualization Center. Waiting to hear from Chairman.

HB2158: The Protective Orders; Central Repository- Passed the House and has been assigned to Senate Judiciary and staff is requesting that the bill be moved to the following week since staff needs more discussions with stakeholders.

HB2168, Use of Force bill, ACJC is neutral on this bill. The bill passed the House and was assigned to Senate Appropriations and Rules. But has not received a hearing. Staff has been in conversations with the lobbyist on this bill.

HB2190: Criminal Justice Case Information- Passed House Criminal Justice Reform on 2/18 with amendment #4319. This bill has been assigned to Senate Judiciary. To date, it has not been assigned a hearing date. ACJC is neutral on this bill but will continue to monitor for the committee.

HB 2260 Arizona Criminal Justice Membership bill, this bill did pass out of the House unanimously and was assigned to Senate Judiciary.

Ms. Edwards explained there are four bills that list ACJC as the fiscal agent. Of the four bills, three are moving. Of the three, one had an amendment on it.

HB2295 – The Brady bill- failed initially to pass the House (29 Y and 30 N), but did pass after it was reconsidered.

HB2713 – Earned Release Credits bill. This bill passed the House (17Y and 11N) and has been assigned to Senate Judiciary. Ms. Edwards referred to the research and data collection that the Department of Corrections and Re-entry is doing to understand the impacts should this bill pass.

HB 2810- Civil Asset Forfeiture bill – Passed the House and has been assigned to Senate Judiciary and Rules.

This concludes the legislative report.

IV. Call to the Public
