### I. Call to Order and Roll Call

Commissioner David Sanders called the meeting to order at 1:30 pm. Ms. Boyle took roll call, and a quorum was declared.

#### II. Minutes of the Febuary 17, 2023 meeting

**Commissioner Sanders** called for a motion on the Committee meeting minutes for February 17, 2023. **Commissioner Steve Stahl** entered a motion to approve the minutes. The motion seconded by **Designee Liana Garcia** was unanimously approved by the Committee.

#### III. Update on ACJC priority legislation and amendments

**Molly Edwards** updated the Committee on the priority legislation thus far. We are 61 days in the legislature, 1,626 bills introduced, and 205 bills tracked by ACJC. SB1588 passed out of appropriations, ACJC met with the sheriffs, and they are now neutral towards the bill. It passed out the rules in both caucuses in the Senate without any issues.

#### IV. Review Introduced Criminal Justice Legislation

Molly Edwards updated the Committee on the key-tracked bills. SB1058, the polygraph bill, is still in the Senate and not moving. SB2242-the unclaimed property locater registration bill that would take \$845,000 from the victim compensation and assistance fund to sweep is being heard in Senate appropriations on Monday. HB2333-coordinated re-entry planning bill, ACJC would receive \$3M appropriated to develop a cross-system recidivism tracking database. It passed out the House, passed the Senate judiciary, and will be in appropriations next week. HB2014-law enforcement response times requirement moved to a study committee. It made it through the House and was transmitted to the Senate. It went through a second read and passed the Senate map.

The two good samaritan bills-ACJC signed on to support both bills. HB2169-went through the House and is on the second read in the Senate. SB1088 passed through the Senate and was the second read in the House. SB1309-aggravated unlawful flight bill passed in the Senate, signed to the House Judiciary, and rules on 3/15. SB1234-photo enforcement ban passed through the Senate and transmitted to the House. HB2808-public records request public time frame is making progress, and votes passed the House unanimously and transmitted to the Senate.
