A public meeting of the Joint Executive Legislative Committee convened on **March 11, 2022**, at the Arizona Criminal Justice Commission office, 1110 W. Washington, Suite 230, Phoenix, AZ 85007.

I. Call to Order and Roll Call

Chairperson David Sanders called the meeting to order at 1:30 pm. **Ms. Boyle** took roll call, and a quorum was declared.

II. Minutes of the March 4, 2022 meeting

Chairperson Sanders called for a motion on the Committee meeting minutes for March 4, 2022. **Commissioner David Byers** entered a motion to approve the minutes. The motion seconded by **Commissioner Jean Bishop** was unanimously approved by the Committee.

III. Review Introduced Criminal Justice Legislation

Molly Edwards, Public Information Officer, reviewed the legislation for ACJC. The legislature has met for 61 days and introduced 1,757 bills. Staff met with Senator David Livingston about **HB2132** - the minimum balance notification, victim fund bill. He recommended placing a one-time appropriation of \$10M into the FY22-23 budget, having an ongoing \$2M budget line item, and receiving funding from the already established victims compensation and assistance fund anywhere from \$2-3M each year. The primary reason to ask for funds from the legislature was to create stability for the victim compensation fund expand the number of victims we could assist. Hopeful the bill gets passage and signed into law. Staff scheduled to go in front of the senate appropriations with this bill. **SB1183** moves AZ POST from the equation and reallocates the CJEF funding to other entities within the formula. This bill moved out of the Senate. HB2573-alternative prosecution diversion fund bill passed out the house with an amendment - reduced to \$10M—and assigned to senate judiciary and appropriations.

HB2044-juvenile dependency and state aid appropriation-The bill appropriates \$10M from the general fund to the state aid for juvenile dependency proceeding fund administered by ACJC. Discussion on working with **Commissioner Jean Bishop** and the County Supervisors Association of Arizona on broadening the bill to use for the dependency side of the public defender and expanding the eligibility of the funding. **HB2326** - criminal justice collection data bill - will require ACJC to collect specific immigration data from the court and post it on the website. The court added an amendment that asked the superior court probation departments to provide this information for those individuals placed on supervised probation. The amendment added by Senator Warren Peterson requires the sheriffs to release to the public the online inmate search function or by phone whether a federal immigration hold is in place on any specific prisoner in the sheriff's custody. The senate judiciary heard the bill. **HB2583** - DUI collection bill that would require ACJC to collect the data from the various law enforcement entities and provide an annual report to the Governor. Waiting to see if Representative John Kavanagh is willing to proceed with language on the bill delaying an effective date of July 2024. The bill passed the house, assigned to the senate judiciary.
