#### Call to Order, Roll Call, and Pledge of Allegiance

Acting Chair David Sanders called the meeting to order at 1:30 pm and led everyone in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance. Andrew LeFevre took roll call, and a quorum was declared.

#### 1. Stakeholder Group Updates

None.

#### 2. Approval of Previous Meeting Minutes

Acting Chair Sanders called for a motion on the Commission meeting minutes on March 16, 2023. Designee Rebecca Baker entered a motion to approve the minutes. The motion seconded by Designee Gretchen McClellan-Singh was unanimously approved by the Commission.

#### 3. Executive Director's Report

#### a. Staff and Program Updates

**Director LeFevre** introduced Bruce Henry as the new research analyst with the statistical analysis center. Staff is hosting a workshop in July at the NCJA/JRSA annual meeting.

#### b. Finance Update

Lisa Kautz gave the financial report as of April 30. Year to date, ACJC received \$7.4M in state funding and \$5.4M in federal funding. The current budget trends are under costs, in personnel at 73 % of the budget, attributing factors are due to vacancy savings; and operating, at 56 % of the total budget. \$3.8M is remaining at the general fund appropriation balance this is anticipated to be expended for the fiscal year with no remaining funds.

### 2. Update on the activities of the Statistical Analysis Center

Matt Bileski stated ACJC was awarded funding from BJA to facilitate Arizona's involvement in Justice Counts as a multi-state initiative for collecting consensus-based metrics, specifically for criminal justice. The voluntary statewide collection will allow criminal justice agencies to accomplish three major components: 1) showcasing their work, 2) advocating for needed resources, and 3) measuring the impact of existing and changing policy initiatives. The staff has tentatively scheduled for the week of June 19-23 to host a Justice Counts webinar.

#### B. Drug Gang and Violent Crime Control

### 1. Update on the activities of the Committee

Tony Vidale provided information on the State Crisis Advisory Board and the intervention grant. As of now, there are people in place to serve on the board, nine commission members and four non-commissioned members.

### 2. FY 2024 Drug, Gang and Violent Crime Control Program Cycle 37 Grant Awards

Mr. Vidale presented the recommendation from the Committee for the Drug, Gang & Violent Crime grant, which is \$3,864,650.44 from the Byrne/JAG grant, \$2,899,651.93 from the Drug Enforcement Fund, and \$2,220,767.39 in local match funds. Designee Marcus Reinkensmeyer entered a motion to approve the FY 2024 Arizona Drug, Gang, and Violent Crime Cycle 37 grant funds to eligible criminal justice agencies; for the period beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2024, except the Attorney General's Office Medicaid Fraud project, funded from October 1, 2023, and ending September 30, 2024. The Commission unanimously approved the motion seconded by Designee Baker.

### 3. FY 2024 Residential Substance Abuse Treatment Program RSAT Grant Award Recommendation

Mr. Vidale explained the FY 2024 Residential Substance Abuse Treatment Program (RSAT) grant awards as shown on page 24 of the agenda. The recommendation funds projects totaling \$356,734.32 from federal funds and \$118,911.44 from local match funds to the Arizona Department of Corrections, Rehabilitation, and Re-entry (Gemini Program), Arizona Department of Juvenile Corrections (RSAT Program), the Yavapai County Sheriff's Office (Reach Out Program), and Chicanos Por La Causa (Corazon Treatment Center). Designee McClellan-Singh entered a motion to approve the award of \$475,645.76 in federal and local cash match funds for the FY 2024 RSAT grant program beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2024. The Commission unanimously approved the motion seconded by Designee Baker.

#### C. Crime Victims

1. Update on the activities of the Committee

Heather Bohnet stated the Committee met on May 10 to discuss crime victim assistance and compensation funding.

2. Crime Victim Assistance Program Grant Awards

Ms. Bohnet presented the recommendation from the Committee to allocate FY24 Crime Victim Assistance grant funds totaling \$813,464.40 for FY24. Designee Baker entered the motion to approve the award of Crime Victim Assistance grant funds for \$813,464.40 in FY24 Crime Victim Assistance grant funds as outlined in Table VS-1 to eligible victim assistance projects for the period beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2024. The Commission unanimously approved the motion seconded by Designee Reinkensmeyer.

3. Crime Victim Compensation Program ARPA Funding Supplement

Ms. Bohnet presented the Committee's recommendation that the Commission approves the \$186,000 ARPA funding supplement for the current FY23 to be allocated to operational units by Table VS-3 on page 33 of the agenda. **Designee Baker** motioned to approve the allocation of ARPA funds for the current FY23 be allocated to operational units in accordance with Table VS-3. The Commission unanimously approved the motion seconded by **Designee McClellan-Singh**.

#### D. Information Technology Systems Improvement

#### 1. Update on the activities of the Committee

**Lloyd Y. Asato** stated the Committee has yet to meet but provided program and funding updates.

- (1) The VINE project divides into two phases. Phase I connect county jail management systems to VINE, and Phase II allows, as optional, using the sheriff's office system to do their automated notifications. Maricopa set to launch their database on May 30, Yavapai on June 6, following up with Apache, Cochise, Greenlee, Navajo, Pinal, and Santa Cruz.
- (2) HB2482 passed and allocates an appropriation of \$10.5M for the expansion of victim notification each year and orders a house committee to study whether or not to include sexual assault notifications.
- (3) On ADRS currently, most prosecutors use the web-based portal, and staff is working with county prosecutors to automate and connect with court management systems directly to ADRS. Cochise is finalizing their testing to go live in the next month. Mohave is moving from the portal submission to an automated connection to ADRS; they currently use e-prosecutor and will build an interface that allows e-prosecutor users in Arizona to connect to ADRS. So far, seven counties and the AG's office have transitioned to automotive reporting. Seventy-five agencies participated in the reporting, and now 97 of the 103 agencies are required to report as enrolled in our reporting.
- (4) HB2168 requires all agencies in Arizona to provide the use of force reporting and use of force incidents beginning January 1, 2022, published on the ACJC website.

#### **Funding Update:**

The program is submitting three grants. The NCHIP grant funds the criminal history improvement for digitalizing criminal history, additional disposition, criminal history backlogs, and overtime. Staff is requesting \$2.45M. On the Coverdell formula grant that supports criminal forensic labs, the staff is asking \$453,000. Lastly, the NICS grant supports records improvement and currently accepting applications for the FY23 cycle.

#### E. Legislative

1. Update on the activities of the Committee

Acting Chair Sanders stated the Committee met in December 2022 and twice a month in January, February, and March 2023.

2. Update on the 2023 Legislative Session

**Molly Edwards** reported the legislature is on its 129th day of the session; 1671 bills were introduced, the legislature passed 250 bills, Governor signed 150 bills into law, and 71 were vetoed. A bipartisan budget passed, and the Governor signed it.

Ms. Edwards touched on some bills impacting ACJC. The ACJC budget bill bottom line stayed the same. The legislature put \$10M into the law victims' notification law enforcement fund. In this session, ACJC introduced two mirror bills – HB2195 and SB1588 – Phase II of the data collection bill appropriation of \$4.7M for the first year and \$4.8M each year after for two years. HN2195 did not pass out of the judiciary and needed more work with stakeholders on data points.

SB1588-working with stakeholders to understand their concerns and address them. It passed from the Senate to the House, passed House appropriations, then parked in the budget and not included. Staff proposed the removal of the appropriation to keep the policy part of the bill moving forward, creating a structure for the program and allowing ACJC to put together a decision package to include in next year's budget process and build the path for criminal justice agencies to report data. ACJC is making clear to House members the system cannot go live until the vote of the Commission, and criminal justice agencies do not need to report until deemed ready by the Commission; the triggers are included in the bill, so reporting would not be required until agencies are prepared.

On a high level, HB2482 sexual assault kits-victim notification bill appropriates \$7.6M to the law enforcement victimization fund, ACJC, to receive \$400,000 to administer the program, signed into law. HB2333-coordinated re-entry planning program allocates \$7M to Yavapai, Mohave, and Pinal counties. ACJC was to receive \$3M to build a cross-recidivism database but was removed during the budget process and signed into law. HB2808-public records request program held in senate government – not moved, HB2168-Good Samaritan Medical Assistance bill sunsets July 2028. **Designee Baker** stated this bill had an emergency clause and, in effect, does not have to wait for the general effective date and sunsetting in July. SB1234-Prohibition on photo enforcement passed House and Senate, sent to the Senate for concurrence—SB1290-inmates documentation workforce re-entry bill – signed into law. SB1309-aggravated unlawful flight from law enforcement – failed third read in the House, and the Polygraph bill did not move. The legislature is re-convening in mid-June.
