#### I. Call to Order and Roll Call

**Commissioner David Sanders** called the meeting to order at 1:30 pm. **Ms. Boyle** took roll call, and a quorum was declared.

#### II. Minutes of the March 10, 2023 meeting

**Commissioner Sanders** called for a motion on the Committee meeting minutes for March 10, 2023. **Commissioner Steve Stahl** entered a motion to approve the minutes. The motion seconded by **Commissioner David Byers** was unanimously approved by the Committee.

#### III. Update on ACJC priority legislation and amendments

**Molly Edwards** stated the legislature is 75 days into the session with 1,630 bills introduced and 206 criminal justice bills tracking. SB1588, a mirror bill to HB2195, died on the floor, was brought back to reconsideration, and did not appear on the third read. It has been rescheduled for a third read on Monday, 4/27, for a vote.

#### IV. Review Introduced Criminal Justice Legislation

**Molly Edwards** reviewed the following tracked bills:

- SB1244 scheduled for house appropriations on 3/29
- SB1058 has stalled and not moving
- SB2242 passed through the senate finance
- HB2805 stalled, went to a second read, and has not moved
- HB2333 passed through senate appropriations, HB2168 and SB1088 are both moving
- SB1309 moved from the senate to the house and passed senate rules on 3/20
- SB1234 passed house rules and both of the caucuses on 3/14
- HB2808 passed out of the house unanimously and will be heard in the senate government on 3/29.

<b>Recommended Action</b>	The Joint Executive/Legislative Committee members recommend to the Commission for approval in concept, the ACJC State County Municipal Online Data System bill language to the legislature for the 2024 legislative session.
<b>Details/Discussion</b>	<p>Staff will provide an overview of the bill, seek feedback, and vote on proposed ACJC-sponsored legislation language. In the 2023 legislative session, ACJC staff worked with the legislature to run mirror bills -SB1588 and HB2195. SB1588 made it to the Governor's desk but was ultimately vetoed due to an amendment added at the end of the process. The proposed bill for the 2024 legislative session mirrors what has been proposed in our budget ask to OSPB.</p> <p>See the attached bill for the proposed language.</p>

<b>Details/Discussion</b>	In 2020, the Commission ran HB2231, adding a Public Defender and a Victims Advocate. The bill failed to pass the House Judiciary Committee. In 2021 - the Commission ran HB2260, which again sought to add a Public Defender and a Victims Advocate. Neither bill has made it beyond the House Judiciary in either session.  See the attached bill language from prior sessions.
