CY 2020 Residential Substance Abuse Treatment Awards

Request

Staff is requesting Committee approval to extend all CY 2020 RSAT projects to June 30, 2021 and provide bridge funding equal to one-half of the CY 2020 award totaling \$275,001, including \$206,251 in federal funds and \$68,750 in match funds. These additional funds will cover the costs associated with approved CY 2020 RSAT projects from January 1, 2021 until June 30, 2021. **Table 1** summarizes the staff recommendation.

Issue Background

At its November 2019 meeting, the Commission approved awards totaling \$550,001 in federal and local cash match funds for the CY 2020 Residential Substance Abuse Treatment grant program. Of this amount, \$412,502 was from federal funds and \$137,499 was from local match funds. *Table 2* displays the federal funding plan for the CY 2020 RSAT Grant Program, including the proposed extension amount.

For CY 2020, the Commission awarded funding to the Coconino County Sheriff's Office (EXODUS Program), ADOCRR (Gemini Program), ADJC (RSAT Program), the Yavapai County Sheriff's Office (Reach Out Program), and Chicanos Por La Causa (Corazon Treatment Center).

As part of the approved recommendation, the Commission included consideration of a 6-month extension option for the CY 2020 RSAT grant. This option allowed the RSAT program to align with the state fiscal year calendar and provide operational and accounting efficiencies for ACJC and stakeholder agencies. The next competitive grant process for RSAT will open in late January 2021 for the state fiscal year 2022 that begins July 1, 2021.

The extension was contingent on funded agencies meeting all grant requirements. All agencies have satisfactorily met grant requirements. The 6-month extension requires an additional \$206,251 in federal funds and \$68,750 in matching funds. *Table 3* shows the total funding for the CY 2020 RSAT grant program, including the extension amounts.
