#### Call to Order, Roll Call and Pledge Allegiance

Chair David Byers called the meeting to order at 10:30 AM and led everyone in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.

Executive Director Andrew LeFevre took roll call and a quorum was declared.

#### 1. Stakeholder Group Updates

Gary Restaino, US Attorney, District of Arizona discussed grant funding options. Bureau of Justice assistance granted \$92M to Arizona entities and \$244M over the last 3 years. Gary Restaino also discussed the partnership with ACJC and Project Safe Neighborhood's and many of the micro grants that ACJC has been administrating for public outreach such as the kid's basketball programs to keep kids off the streets, step teams for girl's, boxing gyms and many more.

William Ring, Coconino County Attorney/Chairperson, Arizona Prosecuting Attorneys' Advisory Council discussed the 2050 Arizona Criminal Justice Services and Infrastructure Symposium. Per the State demographers and Arizona Commerce Authority, Arizona's growth today is about 7.4B citizens and the prediction by 2050 will be at 10.3B. What should the criminal justice structure look like in the next few years or even 25 years.

#### 2. Approval of Previous Meeting Minutes

Chair David Byers called for a motion on the Commission to approve the meeting minutes on May, 16, 2024. Commissioner Lance Spivey entered a motion to approve the minutes. The motion was second by Commissioner David Sanders and was unanimously approved by the Commissioners.

#### 3. Executive Director's Report

#### a. Staff and Program Updates

Executive Director Andrew LeFevre reported that part of the budget deficit budget process, having \$800,000 swept from CJEF funds, admin and crime labs. Salary caps have been implemented and a process to fill vacancies. The agency is working diligently and effortlessly to fill positions. Currently ACJC has a Researcher and Auditor position open. The commissions still have three vacancies, the Mayor, Chief of Maricopa County and small County Sheriff. The Governor's Office is providing ACJC \$2.25M in ARPA funds extended from December to June 30, 2025.

#### b. Finance Update

Lisa Kautz provided updates to the Commissioners with the financial report through June 30, 2024. The commission received \$33.1M in revenue for state and federal funding. Personnel expenditures are at 63% of anticipated budget. Passthrough aid to counties aid to counties \$14.2M in state funding and 9.3M in combination of federal funding for total \$23.5M passed through other organizations. \$195,000 for general fund appropriation balance anticipated for administrative adjustments.

#### c. Approval of DEA Account Yearly Audits

Lisa Kautz provided the DEA Audit had no findings. Chair David Byers called for a motion on the DEA Account Yearly Audit. Commissioner Jean Bishop approved the motion to approve the DEA Yearly Audit as presented and seconded by Nick Klingerman and was unanimously approved by the Commission

#### d. ACJC Budget Issues for FY 25-26

Director Andrew LeFevre explained that each yar, ACJC submits a budget package to the Governor's Office that includes budget issues

2. Update on the activities on the Statistical Analysis Center

Matt Bileski updated on the AYS survey will be released in September that coincides with the Drug Summit and will go out to the schools and districts in August.

3. Review of Criminal Justice Agency Budget and Staffing data

Matt Bielski presented budget and personnel information regarding budgets of criminal justice agencies at the local, county and state level to provide information regarding the funding it takes to support criminal justice activities in Arizona.

#### B. Drug, Gang and Violent Crime Control

1. Update on the activities on the Committee

Tony Vidale reported that the committee has not met since the last commission meeting. Drug, Gang and Violent Crime Control Applied for several grants. The State Crisis Intervention Program Grant for Safer Communities Act allocated about \$15M to Arizona. One allocation already run through the grant process. The second allocation will be a little over \$3.4M, expect to be awarded in September/October. Also applied for formula grant through Residential Substance Abuse Treatment. Submission for the John R. Justice Grant. Community Violence intervention Grant that is competitive for about \$4M and will focus on individuals 24 or younger in high crime areas.

2. FY 2024 AZ State Crisis Intervention Program Grant Update

Siyeni Yitbarek provided program updates for the gun reduction for violence and various programs focused on identifying risks and intervening before harm occurs. In the Federal FY24 solicitation, \$5.5M was available to eligible applicants that the board approved, and \$3M of statewide award passed through \$2M and less than 10,000 jurisdiction of \$191,000. Board endorsed nine projects and the Bureau of Justice approved eight. Subawards approved by BJ total around \$4.1M and comprised of four statewide projects, three local pass-throughs, and less than 10,000 jurisdictions for the Administrative Office of the Courts. Currently, the Cox project is the only project that has incurred project-related expenses of \$43,00 with a balance of the prior solicitation of \$1.3M and expecting \$3.1M available for the next solicitation cycle for January 2025. Federal fiscal year 2024 SKIP application is currently open and closing on July 29, 2024. Molly Edwards presented the Gun Safety Saves Lives Campaign and ads created with Cox Communications Commercials for gun safety.

3. Phoenix Police Department RADAR Project Allocation

Ashley Mully presented to the committee the Desert Horizon Precinct R.A.D.A.R. Program and presented the Committee recommendation to the Commission of allocating \$15,000 to purchase a box camera, solar lighting and installation tools to enhance the implementation of Crime Prevention through Environmental Design (CPTED) principles under the Phoenix Police Department R.A.D.A.R. Program. Det. Craig Maze, Det. Matt Walker, Det. Spencer Warren and Sgt. Jeffrey Tobey presented a brief overview for Desert Horizon Precinct R.A.D.A.R. Program.

Commissioner Russ Skinner motioned to approve the recommendation of allocating \$15,000 to purchase a box camera, solar lighting and installation tools to support the RADAR pilot project. Gretchen McClellan-Singh second the motion and was approved unanimously approved by the Commissioners.

#### **C. Crime Victims**

1. Update on the activities of the Committee

Vice Chair Steve Stahl provided that the Crime Victims Committee met on July 8, 2024.

2. Crime Victim Compensation and Assistance additional FY25 funding allocation

**Dorinda Johns** presented the recommendation from the Committee to the Commission to use any remaining unexpended FY24 American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) grant dollars to provide additional funding to current FY25 Victim Compensation and Victim Assistance grantees in accordance with a plan to be developed by ACJC staff. The FY24 gran year expired on June 30, 2024 and final reports for expenditure reimbursements are due on July 25, 2024. Based on prior expenditure patterns ACJC staff expects that some ARPA dollars allotted to grantees for the FY24 grant period will remain unspent. The unspent dollars can be re-allocated to other purposes once the final financial reports for the agencies have been processed. **Commissioner Steve Stahl motioned to table. Commissioner Brad Carlyon** seconded the motioned to table the Crime Victim Compensation and Assistance additional FY25 Funding Allocation.

#### D. Informational Technology Systems

Lloyd Y. Asato updated the Committee that two grants submitted. One formula for Coverdell for Crime Labs for \$450,000 and the second is NICS Record Improvement grant that is a competitive grant for \$1.8M. Procurement has awarded the contract for HB 2482 for Crime Victim Notification to provide tools and systems to law enforcement agencies. Appriss Insights has been awarded the contract. Presenting the project justification meetings to the ITAC Committee.

- 2. 2024 Legislative Summary

Molly Edwards reported trends and bills associated with this session. Mrs. Edwards is working with Samson Niemotka at ACJC to create a user-friendly tracking system. Budget sweeps occurred during the last session, 56<sup>th</sup> legislative session began on January 8 of this year and Sine Die on June 15<sup>th</sup> with a total of 160 days. This year 1,663 bills were introduced, 332 were passed, 259 were signed into law, and 73 were vetoed. ACJC tracked 173 criminal justice bills. HB2073 did not make it out of Committee but mirrored SB1117 moved through, but got stuck in the budget. HCR2060 will be the largest unfunded mandate up to the voters. The Crime Victim Stabilization Act SB4514 will allow surplus funds from the False Claims Act to be directed to the victim spun in an effort to stabilize the crime victim funding. ACJC is going forward with the Sunset authorization working diligently with the leadership team. Commissioner Brad Carlyon moved to approve the release of the 2024 Legislative Report.

Commissioner Chief Kara Riley second the motion. The motion was approved unanimously.
