#### **Awards and Recognition**

- 1. Call to the Public. Those persons wishing to speak should complete a speaker's card and present it to the host. Unless prior approval has been granted by the Chairman, comments will be limited to no more than three minutes. No discussion or action will be taken by the Commission. Any items requiring further discussion or action will be included on a future Commission meeting agenda.
  - 2. Consent Agenda. The following items have been grouped together and are hereby noticed as consent agenda items to expedite action on routine matters, which may not require public discussion. The Commission will be asked to approve briefings and updates without further public input or discussion and to approve other matters as presented, subject to approval or recommendations of the Commission's legal counsel. Commission members may remove certain items if further public input or discussion is deemed necessary.
    - Approve License Agreement with Freeport Minerals Corporation. Presenter: Tony Guiles, Assistant Director. The Commission may approve the License Agreement with Freeport Minerals Corporation for the purpose of installing a Lifejacket Loaner Station along the Verde River on Freeport Minerals Corporation property.

- 3. State and Federal Legislation. Presenter: Ed Sanchez, Legislative Liaison. The Commission will be briefed on the status of State and Federal legislation. The Commission may take a position or provide direction to the Department for coordination, action, or proposed changes to legislation or other elective issues related to Department responsibilities.
- 4. Commission Priorities Update. Presenter: Kent Komadina, Special Assistant to the Director. The Department will provide an update on the Commission Priorities and Metrics and will provide an expanded presentation by Wildlife Recreation Branch Chief, Scott Lavin regarding Promote Fair Chase.

- 11. Rehearing Request Regarding Previous License Revocation/Civil Assessment. Presenter: Gene F. Elms, Law Enforcement Branch Chief. Alan Christopherson has requested a rehearing regarding the revocation of his license privileges.
- 12. Petition by Hans W. Giesholt to Amend R12-4-517. Watercraft Motor and Engine Restrictions. Presenter: Gene Elms, Law Enforcement Branch Chief. The Commission will be asked to review the petition submitted by Mr. Giesholt to Amend R12-4-517. Watercraft Motor and Engine Restrictions. The requested amendment is to prohibit the use of a watercraft using a gasoline engine on C.C. Cragin Reservoir. The Department will recommend that the Commission vote to deny the petition submitted by Mr. Giesholt.
- 13. Petition by Mr. Bradford Black to be granted a refund or a new bison tag for 2020. Presenter: Jennifer Stewart, Branch Chief, Customer Support and Sales Branch. Mr. Black is requesting he be granted a refund or a new bison tag for 2020 because heavy snow kept the herd on the Grand Canyon National Park.
- 14. Approval for Exportation of Sonoran Pronghorn to Sonora, Mexico. Presenter: Jim deVos, Assistant Director, Wildlife Management Division. The Commission may approve that the Arizona Game and Fish Department will work with the Mexican Government to improve the genetic variability of Sonoran Pronghorn by exporting animals over the next two years to support range-wide recovery goals.
- 15. Landowner-Lessee/Sportsman Relations Committee Appointment. Presenter: Don Larsen, Landowner Relations Program Supervisor. The Department's Landowner Relations Program has received nominations for two individuals to fill two vacant spots

on the Landowner-Lessee/Sportsman Relations Committee. Mr. Stephen Clark and Mr. Matthew Kile are both interested in helping to improve access issues. The Commission may vote to take action on, or provide the Department direction on this item.

16. Off-cycle Request to Amend Commission Order 40 at Festival Fields Park (Avondale) and Graham County Fairgrounds Park (Safford). Presenter: Scott Gurtin, Community Fishing Program Manager. The Commission may vote to amend Commission Order 40: Fish, establishing bag and possession limits within Festival Fields Pond and Graham County Fairgrounds Pond.

One or more members of the Commission may appear and participate in the meeting telephonically or by other electronic means.

Funding is provided from the sale of licenses and permits; watercraft registration fees; federal excise taxes on firearms, fishing equipment, boats, and other sporting goods; State lottery revenues; donations on State income tax forms; and various contracts and grants. Department policy is set by the Arizona Game and Fish Commission, whose five members are appointed by the Governor.
