## Welcome/Introductions

- 1. Consent Agenda. The following items have been grouped together and are hereby noticed as consent agenda items to expedite action on routine matters, which may not require public discussion. The Commission will be asked to approve briefings and updates without further public input or discussion and to approve other matters as presented, subject to approval or recommendations of the Commission's legal counsel. Commission members may remove certain items if further public input or discussion is deemed necessary.
  - a. Approve Utility Permit Agreement with Arizona Public Service Company. Presenter: Tyler Williford, Region IV Habitat Specialist. Utility Permit Agreement with Arizona Public Service Company for the purpose of providing power to Planet Ranch.
- 2. Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) with the Natural Resources Conservation Service. Presenter: Don Larsen, Landowner Relations and Habitat Enhancement Program Manager. The Commission may vote to authorize the Department to execute and amend as necessary a Memorandum of Agreement with the Natural Resources Conservation Service for the purpose of receiving and implementing a Voluntary Public Access and Habitat Improvement Program grant.

- 3. Request to Approve Proposed Rulemaking Amending Article 2 Rules Addressing Licenses, Permits, Stamps, and Tags. Presenter: David Fernandez, Legislative Specialist. The Department will ask the Commission to vote to approve a Notice of Rulemaking Docket Opening, Notice of Proposed Rulemaking, and Economic Impact Statement amending rules within Article 2 Rules Addressing Licenses, Permits, Stamps, and Tags.
- **4. Shooting Range Development Grant Requests for FY 2021. Presenter: Matthew Schwartzkopf, Statewide Shooting Range Administrator.** The Department's Shooting Range Development Grant Program received five grant applications for fiscal year 2021. The Department will ask the Commission to approve all five applications, totaling \$100,000 of the \$100,000 available. The Commission may vote to take action on, or provide the Department direction on this item.

- c. Litigation and Legal Advice. The Commission may vote to meet in executive session in accordance with A.R.S. § 38-431.03(A)(3) and (4) for the purpose of discussing and consulting with legal counsel for legal advice in order to consider its position and to instruct legal counsel regarding the Commission's position concerning the legal strategy recommendations from the Department's legal strategies team.
- **d.** Litigation and Legal Advice. The Commission may vote to meet in executive session in accordance with A.R.S. § 38-431.03(A)(3) and (4) for the purpose of discussing and consulting with legal counsel for legal advice regarding the Department's legal authority when stray livestock present the potential for catastrophic destruction to wildlife.
- **e.** Litigation and Legal Advice. The Commission may meet in executive session in accordance with A.R.S. § 38-431.03(A)(3) and (4) for the purposes of discussing and consulting with legal counsel for legal advice in order to consider its position and to instruct legal counsel regarding the Commission's position concerning an alleged criminal damage claim against an individual the Commission has taken license revocation action.
- **f.** Legal Advice. The Commission may vote to meet in executive session in accordance with A.R.S. § 38-431.03(A)(3) for the purpose of discussing and consulting with legal counsel for legal advice regarding the Commission's authority to close state trust lands to hunting and to close roads providing access to state trust lands.
- **g.** Purchase of Real Property and Legal Advice. The Commission may vote to meet in Executive Session pursuant to A.R.S § 38-431.03(A)(3) and (7) for the purpose of discussion or consultation with Department staff in order to consider its position and instruct its representative regarding the purchase of real property and for the purpose of discussing and consulting with legal counsel for legal advice.
- **h.** Contract Negotiations. The Commission may vote to meet in executive session pursuant to A.R.S. § 38-431.03(A)(4) for purposes of discussion or consultation with the Commission's legal counsel in order to consider its position and instruct legal counsel regarding the Commission's position on negotiations over the GCNP Draft Bison Reduction Agreement.
- i. **Personnel Matters.** The Commission may vote to go into executive session in accordance with A.R.S. § 38-431.03(A)(1) to discuss personnel matters associated with the Director's duties, responsibilities and performance. The Commission may take action in the public session or defer any action to a later date.

Carefree Highway, Phoenix, at Department regional offices in Pinetop, Flagstaff, Kingman, Yuma, Tucson, Mesa and at the meetings.

The Commission may go into Executive Session for the purpose of obtaining legal advice from the Commission Attorneys on any of the above agenda items pursuant to A.R.S. § 38-431.03 (A) (3) & (4). One or more members of the Commission may appear and participate in the meeting telephonically or by other electronic means.

In addition, the Department is charged with promoting safe and responsible use of watercraft and off-highway vehicles. Funding is provided from the sale of licenses and permits; watercraft registration fees; federal excise taxes on firearms, fishing equipment, boats, and other sporting goods; State lottery revenues; donations on State income tax forms; and various contracts and grants. Department policy is set by the Arizona Game and Fish Commission, whose five members are appointed by the Governor.
