ACJC Priority Bills

HB2166: CRIMINAL JUSTICE COMMISSION; DATA COLLECTION- INTRODUCED

Arizona Criminal Justice Commission is authorized, unless prohibited by federal or state law, to require any state or local "criminal justice agency" (defined elsewhere in statute) to submit any necessary information that is currently collected and readily reportable by the criminal justice agency at the time of the request. The Commission is required to conduct a comprehensive survey of data contained in criminal justice records systems housed at local and state criminal justice agencies in order to create a state criminal justice data inventory report identifying what data is housed at each type of agency. By August 1, 2022, the Commission is required to submit the inventory report to the Governor and the Legislature and make the report available on its website. Information that must be included in the report is specified. Contains a legislative intent section. Appropriates \$300,000 from the general fund in FY2021-22 to the Commission to complete the report.

HB2260: ARIZONA CRIMINAL JUSTICE COMMISSION; MEMBERSHIP- INTRODUCED

Increases the number of members of the Arizona Criminal Justice Commission to 16 members by adding one public defender and one victim advocate, both of whom are appointed by the Governor. First sponsor: Rep. Blackman (R - Dist 6)

Others: Rep. Bolick (R - Dist 20)

HB2158: PROTECTIVE ORDERS; CENTRAL REPOSITORY; NOTIFICATION- INTRODUCED

The Supreme Court is required to maintain a central repository for orders of protection and injunctions against harassment (central repository). Within 24 hours after the affidavit, declaration, acceptance or return of service has been filed, excluding weekends and holidays, the court from which the order or injunction was issued is required to enter the filing into the central repository. The Supreme Court is required to transmit copies of the order and proof of service from the central repository to the sheriff of the county where the court is located, and the sheriff is required to register the order of protection or injunction with the National Crime Information Center.

Bills that Place a Requirement on ACJC or lists ACJC:

HB2141- APPROPRIATIONS; ALTERNATIVE PROSECUTION; DIVERSION PROGRAM - INTRODUCED

Appropriates \$11,264,625 from the general fund in each of FY2021-22, FY2022-23, and FY2023-24 to the **Arizona Criminal Justice Commission** for alternative prosecution and diversion programs. Specifies amounts that must be allocated each fiscal year to each county attorney's office. Monies may be used only to establish and operate alternative prosecution and diversion programs, and to explore, develop, apply and evaluate evidence-based best practices for alternative prosecution and diversion programs. By September 30 of 2022, 2023, and 2024, the Commission is required to report to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee on the use of the monies and the outcomes obtained by the alternative prosecution and diversion programs during the previous fiscal year.

HB2164 – COORDINATED REENTRY PLANNING SERVICES PROGRAMS

Counties are authorized to establish a coordinated reentry planning services program within a county jail for the purpose of screening and assessing persons who are booked into the jail and connecting those persons with behavioral health and substance use disorder treatment providers at the earliest possible stage in the criminal justice process. Elements that must be included in the program are specified. The county is required to establish a committee to develop the program's policies and procedures, and stakeholders that must be represented on the committee are listed. Appropriates \$8 million from the general fund in FY2021-22 and \$7 million from the general fund in each of FY2022-23 and FY2023-24 to the newly established Coordinated Reentry Planning Services Program Fund for the program. Appropriates \$8 million from the Fund in FY2021-22 and \$7 million from the Fund in each of FY2022-23 and FY2023-24 to a county with a population of up to 1.5 million persons (any county but Maricopa) to establish and operate a coordinated reentry planning services program. Each eligible county is required to receive a proportional share of the monies based on the county's population.

HB2189- COORDINATED REENTRY PLANNING SERVICES PROGRAMS
